CORVAIR PERGATORY UPDATE BY MIKE CALLAHAN

Happy July—So, Finally got station wagon back from paint shop and took elcorvino to another paint shop. Bought a 34 Ford project car.

FOR SALE

- 64 convertible silver, PG resealed engine \$4,000.
- 1955 Studebaker Commander \$12,000. Beautiful car never any rust.
- 140 motors complete including dual exhaust and air cleaner – \$1,500 runs great
- 27 rebuilt heads \$500 a pair
- Tons of parts, call me with your needs

Work in progress I have more projects on my list than are listed here, but these made it to the priority list.

66 Coupe A/c PG, 4 wheel disc brakes. Feb: got this one back from paint shop, putting it back together, lots of time spent on finding the best parts I have to go back on and painting some of them. Got side windows in, door and vent weather strips on new fuzzies installed, clips for windshield and back window installed, bumpers mounted, all exterior chrome on. Ready to work on the interior. Mar: collecting more parts, moved the PG shifter to the ash tray so I could install a corsa dash. Been working on replacing gauges. April: Installed bracket and rubber weather strip above windows on both sides. Installed glove compartment cardboard and door, installed half of the a/c hoses in the dash. Have a hold to find a better A/C center vent. May: routed the oil pressure sensor and pressure sending unit to the side rail by the battery. Ted Brown is 3D printing a part for the center A/C vent so I can get going on this project again June: back from paint shop. Installed headlights, tail lights, doors, hood. Removed overspray from windshield. Collecting parts to start putting it back together. All windows are out. Ordering headliner and misc parts to complete it.

62 Wagon - Waiting on painter to finish painting Dec: body is ready for paint, due to be done in early Jan. Mar:still not paint, Still need both vent windows, must be tinted. May:found tinted vent windows, still waiting for painting June: Engine ready. ready to start on interior including headlinet

26 Dodge Brothers Delux coupe with LS motor and 4L60e trans, 1ton rearend Needs: Paint and body reassembled. Been at body shop for 3 years. Engine installed and running **Jun**: Moved body to another paint shop, hope to get it back in late fall.

66 Corvair LS motor implant: Dec: moved it back to the main work area and made it high priority to get it moving on its own around the yard. Did more extensive wiring to get it to start in Park ONLY, got wipers working, back up lights. Found one of my O2 sensor bungs welded in, but no hole in the exhaust pipe. Motor is running good, e-brake installed and working. Had to have Ted Brown mill down some bracket parts to bring the power steering pulley in line with the other pulleys. Jan: running good and I think the brakes are good. Just need to get it out on the road and test it. Still needs he dash modified and welded in, had to move the fire wall back 6 inches and now the dash needs to be moved. Mar: Back on the brakes, was not happy with them on the road test. Removed the equalizer and installed the check valves for front and rear. Re doing the E-brakes. Have a doner car, will cut the dash out and weld it in with a 6" extension to accomodate the fire wall being moved back 6". April: Tried to drive the car through the back wall of the garage. Yup no brakes. It's not moving again until I have good brakes. May: change hood, pulled out the pushed in front end. Going to remove the power brake booster and see if I can get the brakes to work. Very frustrating. Jun: completed repositioning master cylinder, had to remove the power assist to make room for the front tire. Brakes are finally working. Bought a device that plugs into EBD11 port and has readout for a number of sensors.

62 8-Door Greenbrier with Brown EFI

Needs weather stripping around all 8 doors April: installed weather strip on driver and passenger door and one of the side doors. May added radio and speakers, van running great and is my daily driver.

68 Ultravan: Bought an Ultravan Needs:

drive train break in on pallet, installed and road tested, all new plumbing, gas lines, toilet Mar: got the rebuilt motor running on a pallet, installed in the Ultravan. Will test drive next month and start working on the other needs. April: rebuilt all 4 brakes and new master cylinder, greased all the points I could grease on the ultravan. May: removed all plumb—

ing, replaced with Pex and tested. Installed new retro refridgerator and microwave. Took out the jack stands and is now resting on all 4s. Ready to start and go for test drive. **June**: Engine is running and it is moving on its own. Completed propane plumbing and checking for leaks. Ordering new toilet.

61 El Corvino: Needs: finish final body prep, get both doors and hood ready, prime and paint. Out of frustration, I am going to paint this one good enough to drive it. Mar: rebuilt the driver door, much welding and cutting up and coupe door for parts May: installed driver door, got it running and drove around the yard. June: rebuilt passenger door. Off to the body shop, they promised it beginning of July.

64 convertible silver: Needs final wiring in dash and engine compartment. DEC: Completed wiring, ready for test and sale

62 Studebaker Hawk Gran tourisimo:

Needs: rear brake work and a/c wiring Dec: completed wiring and started engine, need to reset valves as they are a bit noisy, but runs good. Mar: Rear brakes are grabbing, need to check it out and get A/c working May: replaced rear brake shoes, wheel cylinders, installed corvair e brake cables and welded them to the Studebaker cables. Fixed transmission leak, ready to get it out and drive it.

66 Red A/C convertible Needs: some run time to break in new engine, a/c hooked up May: started to replace the chrome convertible parts.

66 mid engine Ford v–8 Kalmark Kit, only one known to exist Needs more sheet metal in the floor of the old engine compartment and some TLC on the interior Feb: almost done, sheet metal cut and in place, headliner painted, engine cover made and installed
